## ***Enquiries in 2020***

You will meet with your Home Group teacher on your first day of school in 2020, and then at the start of each morning. # Year 7 Camp 2020

## Birrigai - Tidbinbilla Nature Reserve

### For Parents/Carers

The purpose of Year 7 camp is to introduce students to a new environment, for students to meet new people, and to have a lot of fun. All Year 7 students are strongly encouraged to attend.

The Year 7 Camp is focused on building positive relationships with peers, senior students in the school and staff. The activities that will be undertaken during the two days are designed to be interesting, engaging and challenging. Students will work in small teams to build confidence and resilience as well as challenge and enjoy themselves. Our Year 10 Peer Support Leaders will have a mentoring role during the camp.

The camp will be run by Birrigai teachers. Birrigai programs are delivered by their on-site teachers who also hold nationally-recognised outdoor education qualifications. Due to large numbers, all Year 7 students will be attending the camp in two equal groups. The first group will attend the overnight camp in Week 7 Term One on 16-17 March. The second group will attend in Week 9 on 30-31 March. Students will complete activities such as Crate Climb, Gibraltar Peak Walk, Giant Swing / Team Rescue, Abseil and team building exercises in their home groups.



### ***What Subjects will I do?***

You will do eight subjects in year 7, and seven in years 8 to 10:

All students study English, Mathematics, Science, HaSS (Humanities and Social Studies) and PE:

- Students get to choose if they will study either French or Indonesian: Students who do not return their language choice sheet by Fri 8 Nov will be assigned a language class based on availability.
- Year 7 students will also be assigned a range of other elective subjects: These may include: art, computing, food and fabric, wood/metal technology, drama and music (except students in the Band Program).

### ***What is Home Group?***

This is when the roll is marked. You will need to arrive to Home Group on time at 8:53am.

It is important that you develop morning routines to ensure you are on time to school every day.

If you are late, you must sign in at the front office. Your parents will be notified by text.

Daily Notices are read. Student Forum representatives discuss issues, give and receive feedback about student concerns which have been/will be raised in the Forum meetings.

On your first day you will be given a timetable with the Home Group name, room and teacher on it. Home Groups are named after Lyneham High School House teams, which are:

Blaxland	Hume
Mitchell	Sturt

These Houses compete against each other in a range of activities, such as at sporting carnivals, competitions and fun days – to earn points to try and become the champion house for the year.

### ***How do I know where to go?***

You will be given a printed timetable on your first day at school. If you have a phone or similar device, we strongly encourage you to take a photo of your timetable in case you lose it. Replacement timetables are always available from the Front Office.

Peer Support leaders will help you find your classes, particularly on the first few days.

### ***Who are Peer Support Leaders and what do they do?***

The Year 10 Peer Support Leaders are a group of students who applied to be in this class.

Their job is to help you learn about how we do things at Lyneham High School, where places such as classrooms and the canteen are; what kind of services are available and who you can approach for help with both your academic and social needs.

They will join your Home Group regularly during Semester One and they will run five sessions which will help you build emotional wellbeing.

### ***What do I do with my bag during a normal school day?***

You take your bag with you from class to class. During assemblies your bag is locked in your Home Group room. During PE your bag is locked in the change rooms. If you get a locker, you don't have to carry as much in your bag.

***What books and other equipment do I need?***

You are encouraged to buy the specialised stationery items which are recommended by the school. Details will be on the website, and emailed out to families in term 4 2019.

A range of general items, and items for each subject, will be listed. Decide which new items you need – it is okay to keep using pens, pencils, etc that you already own. If you have trouble purchasing any of these items, let your teachers and Year coordinators know.

For Mathematics, you can borrow a textbook from the library which you keep for your use, and then return at the end of the year.

***When will I get my Chromebook?***

Students who have submitted their acceptance form by the due date of 8 November 2019 will be issued their Chromebook early in 2020.

You are responsible for ensuring that you bring your fully charged Chromebook to school every day.

***What happens if I feel unwell when I'm at school?***

Ask your teacher to go to sick bay at the front office. The front office will provide first aid and generally look after you, and call a parent/carer to collect you if necessary. Don't call or text your parents from class.

***What do I do if I need support?***

First point of contact would be your Home Group teacher or Year Coordinator. Ms Darragh can be found in the Science Staff Room and Ms Nagy can be found in the Music Staff Room.

Lyneham High School also has Psychologists available if you require extra support. The Student Support team can also be found near the Front Office (in the orange/Technology corridor).

***Where do I go for information?***

- The school website ([www.lynehamhs.act.edu.au](http://www.lynehamhs.act.edu.au)). This provides basic information about the school and its programs.
- LENNI (access via the school website). This is a dynamic on-line platform with specific information on the curriculum areas.
- Google Classroom. Most of the learning from your classes will be accessible anywhere and anytime on the Google Classroom pages.

# Attendance and Absence

## Notifications

If you are not going to come to school, or will be late, our preference is for your parent/carer to advise the school in advance via a phone call on 6142 1176 or email to [LynehamHS.Absences@ed.act.edu.au](mailto:LynehamHS.Absences@ed.act.edu.au).

On any day that you have not arrived by approximately 9:30am, a parent/carer will be sent an SMS message advising your absence and seek an explanation. They can reply to the SMS with their explanation.

School starts at 8:53am. If you are late, you must sign-in at the front office. If you do not have an explanation for your late arrival from your parent/carer, an SMS message will be sent home on Friday to advise them of your lateness to school and seek an explanation. Again, explanations can be provided by return SMS.

## Leaving During the Day

If you need to leave during the day (eg for an appointment), you will need a note to get out of class. The options for this are:

- Your parent/carer can give you a note at home, and you show it to the teacher.
- Your parent/carer can ask the front office (email, in person or over the phone) to send a 'pink note' via runner to your classroom. This approach can sometimes cause delay if, for example, you're in a PE class or your class has temporarily gone to another location.

In either case, you will need to come to the front office to sign out.

## Absence Explanations

Explanations for absences must provide a reasonable excuse, and can be provided via return SMS, phone call, email, written note, or in person. Examples of a 'reasonable excuse' may include:

- illness, including recovery from major illness, injury or medical condition
- medical or dental treatment
- bereavement
- religious or cultural observation
- sanctioned extended absence in relation to children of travelling families
- attendance at court or other legal hearings or meetings associated with hearings
- participation in sanctioned debates, sports, musical or theatrical productions not directly arranged by the school, or
- participation in interstate, national, or international academic or sporting events or equivalent.

Sleeping in or traffic delays, particularly if these become regular occurrences, are not generally considered reasonable excuses.

# Excursions and Notes

Lyneham High offers a wide range of enrichment opportunities for our students. For example, each year, approximately 200 excursions are conducted in a wide range of fields: sporting, musical, cultural, wellbeing and various curriculum areas. Some of these are for whole-school or other large cohorts, and some are for small niche groups.

For these opportunities to run smoothly, we're heavily dependent on students returning permission / medical notes by the due dates.

**Late notes are not accepted.**

Students must hand notes in at the Front Office. Incomplete (including without the medical note) or unsigned notes are not accepted.

Past experience indicates that many students forget to hand in notes, or leave them until the last minute. This results in disappointment if they are off sick, or otherwise unable to submit, on the due date. We are therefore seeking the cooperation of parents and carers to ensure that **students are accountable for their actions, by submitting notes early, and avoid these potential disappointments.**

# Lockers

Lockers will be available for hire from the first day of school on Monday 3 February 2020, in the front foyer. Payments for 2020 lockers **WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED IN 2019.**

There is no shortage of lockers – experience in recent years is that there have always been spares.

Larger ‘band’ lockers will only be issued if you have a need for more storage space. This may include SEAL students who have gained the consent of the SEAL coordinator to have a larger locker. For band students, this will include those who play the trumpet, alto saxophone, bass, clarinet, French horn or tenor saxophone. Band lockers are not issued to students with large instruments such as bass guitar; or those with small instruments such as flute, oboe or clarinet, as these instruments fit in a normal size locker.

Locker hire is \$20 per year and should be paid in cash. *Payments made by any other method will likely cause a delay in the locker being issued, particularly on the first few days of 2020.*

You are required to adhere to the following conditions of hire.  
You:

- **WILL NOT** swap your designated padlock with any other student
- **WILL NOT** use a padlock brought from home on your locker
- **WILL NOT** share your locker with any other student
- **WILL NOT** share your padlock combination with any other student
- **WILL** keep your locker clean and will not wilfully damage it
- **WILL** pay a replacement fee of \$20 if they damage or lose your padlock



# **Liability for the Loss, Damage or Theft of Students' Personal Property at School**

Parents and students are advised that Lyneham High School staff will take all reasonable steps to keep personal property safe. However, Lyneham High School does not provide insurance cover to automatically compensate for the loss, damage or theft of bicycles or any other personal property and nor will they be legally liable for their loss.

## **Parents and students are advised:**

- to avoid bringing valuable property to school
- to take steps to insure all valuable items for loss, theft or damage
- to use a good quality chain or bar lock to secure bicycles within the bike compound when left at school
- that valuable items are brought to school at the personal risk of the owner and that schools decline any responsibility for the damage, loss or theft of students' personal property
- to report any suspicious activity to school staff

## **Lost Property**

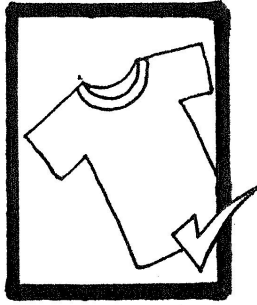
Items of lost property are taken to the Student Youth Workers' office. The school will endeavour to return labelled items to students. At the end of each term, uncollected uniform items are placed in the second hand clothing pool, and other clothing items are donated to local charities.

The school encourages students who have lost valuables (such as phones) to make several attempts to locate the item. At a minimum, they should check classrooms, staff rooms, the front office and the lost property pool.

# School Uniform

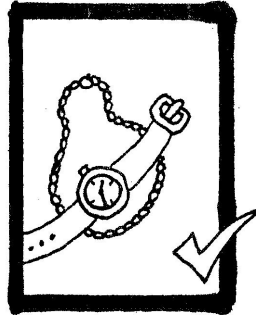
## Acceptable Clothing

Clothes must follow the school colour code: either as an item purchased from the school uniform shop or plain BLUE or plain MAROON.



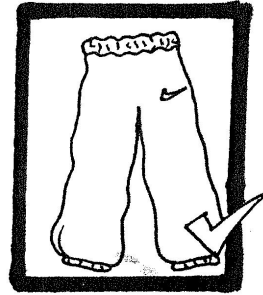
Tops must be long enough to cover the midriff and have sleeves.

Tank tops, singlets, muscle tops are not to be worn.



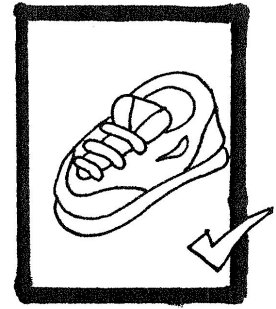
Make-up and jewellery must be kept to a minimum.

Spike/stud jewellery or any other item that could be used as a weapon are not to be worn.



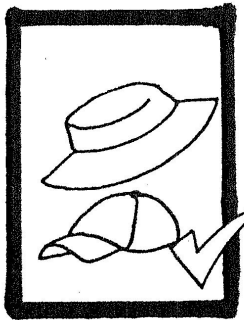
Logos/pictures should be no larger than a 10cm circle.

Pants, shorts & skirts should be dark coloured.



Closed in shoes must be worn.

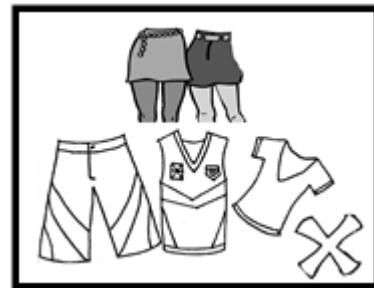
Moccasins, Ugg boots, thongs or sandals are not to be worn.



Hats should be worn outside, but not in class.



Ideally students should wear a school top or jumper.



Skirts & shorts should come to mid-thigh.

Multi-coloured clothes wear including short skirts/shorts, low-cut tops and pants are not to be worn.

## Special requirements:

- PE – white PE t-shirt, blue or black sport shorts/track pants & joggers.
- Science & Technology – long hair must be tied back.
- The SEAL polo shirt is compulsory for all SEAL students to wear to SEAL classes.
- The BAND polo shirt and cap are compulsory for all Band students to wear for performances.
- Students may wear the Band or SEAL polo shirts as an everyday uniform item if they wish.
- Students on the oval or basketball courts must wear the above colour code or they will be required to move to the quad or indoor areas. This policy is to make it easier for staff and students to identify intruders.

Clothing with racist, sexist, anti-social or inappropriate images or slogans are not to be worn at any time.

must provide the school with a completed **Known Medical Condition Response Plan** form. This form is in addition to any Emergency Treatment Plan (or similar) form that you may have already provided to the school.



These plans must be reviewed annually. Parents/carers must inform the school immediately if there are any changes to the plan.

Our school timetables are based on seven 'lines' which repeat seven times through a fortnight. Each line matches up with one of your subjects (usually, except we sometimes also have 'split' lines). You can see how that works in this **generic timetable**:

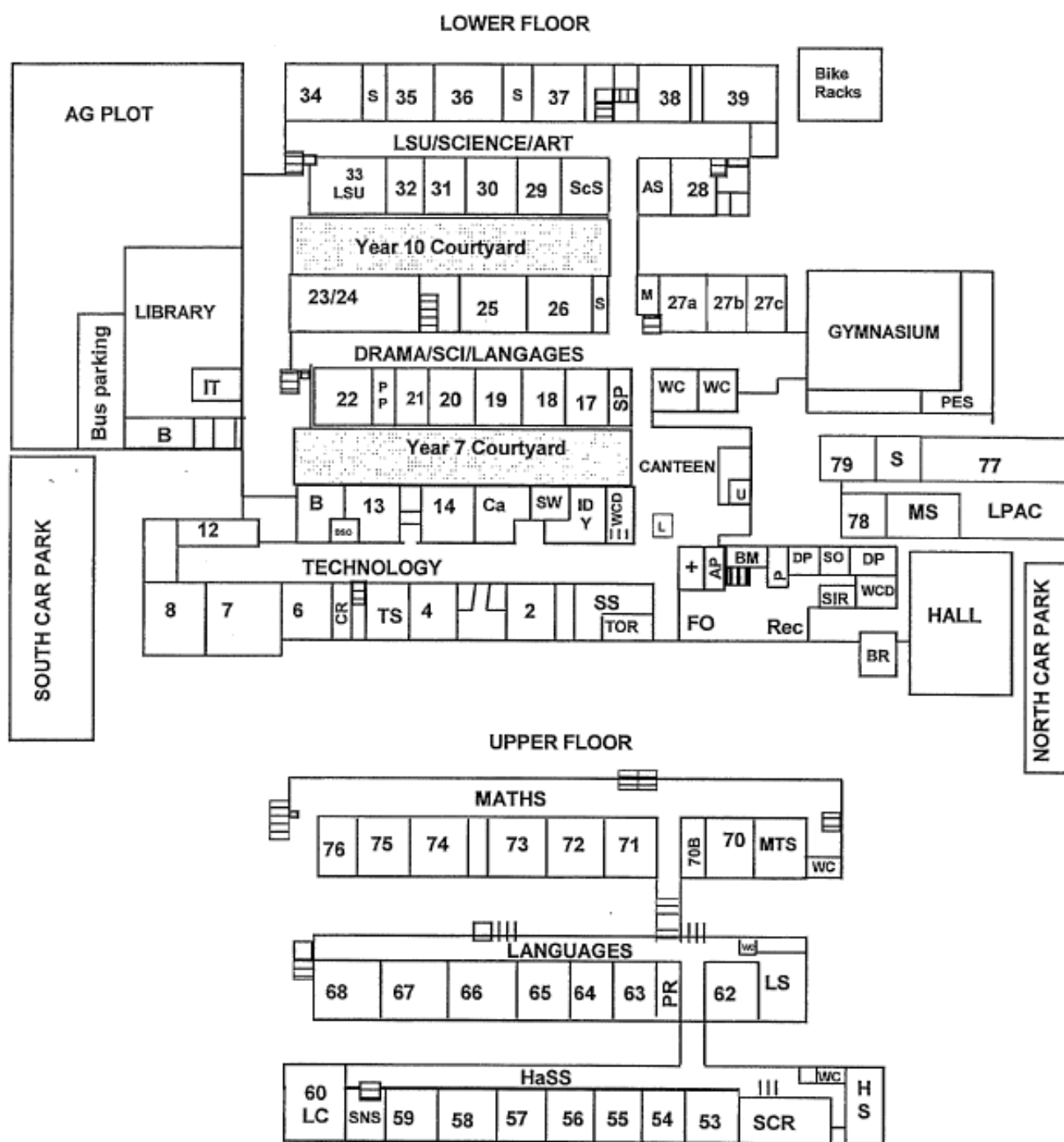
